# LEARNING IN YEAR 5

The Year 5 curriculum has been planned in line with the Key Stage 2 National Curriculum. We will continue to teach key skills and knowledge through a theme-based curriculum to engage and inspire the children. In Year 5 we encourage independent learning throughout the year and equip the children with the skills to begin taking responsibility for their own learning.



# BEHAVIOUR AND EXPECTATIONS

We have high expectations of behaviour and learning in Year 5, as reflected throughout the school. However, we do encourage the children to "step up" and take more responsibility for their learning, behaviour and attitudes when they join us in Upper Key Stage 2 as we begin to prepare them for their journey on to high school.



# UNIFORM

Children in Year 5 will be expected to wear a formal white shirt and a Webheath tie, which can be purchased from Orchard Clothing. The rest of the uniform remains the same.

# PE AND OUTDOOR

Children will come into school on their PE day (to be confirmed) wearing PE kit to ensure we make the most of our PE time. We expect that children in Year 5 have shin pads as part of their PE kit. All other PE kit remains the same (white polo top, burgundy shorts/tracksuit bottoms, burgundy jumper and trainers). We also recommend that children in Upper Key Stage 2 have studded football boots so that we are able to make use of the field in all weathers.



# SCHOOL EQUIPMENT

In Year 5 children are expected to take greater responsibility for their belongings. They will need to have a pencil case of their own with the following equipment:

- HB pencil
- Black handwriting pen (not biro, though gel and rollerball pens are acceptable)
  - 15cm ruler
  - Coloured pencils
  - Sharpener
  - Glue stick

We discourage "novelty" pencil cases and would recommend a clear plastic pencil case for all these items. Please do encourage your child to be responsible for these belongings and ensure that pencil cases are replenished when necessary.



# LOCKERS AND PEGS

Children in Year 5 will be allocated either a peg in their classroom or a locker. If they are allocated a locker, the locker key is the responsibility of the child. They must ensure that the key is kept safe. Most lockers have a spare key that is kept in school. If a locker key is lost or damaged, then it is their responsibility to replace it swiftly; without a key the locker cannot be used.



# HOMework

In Year 5 children will be given a homework diary to record the homework they are set, again to encourage them to take more responsibility for their learning and attitude. Homework diaries also contain useful information that the children can utilise to assist with their learning.

Homework will consist of 3 weekly pieces, a Maths, English and reading comprehension. We may also send home theme-based homework where opportunity arises. We hope that this will help children become more responsible and independent.

Homework will be set and recorded on Seesaw and is the responsibility of the child to ensure that their homework is accessed and posted on Seesaw in a timely manner.
